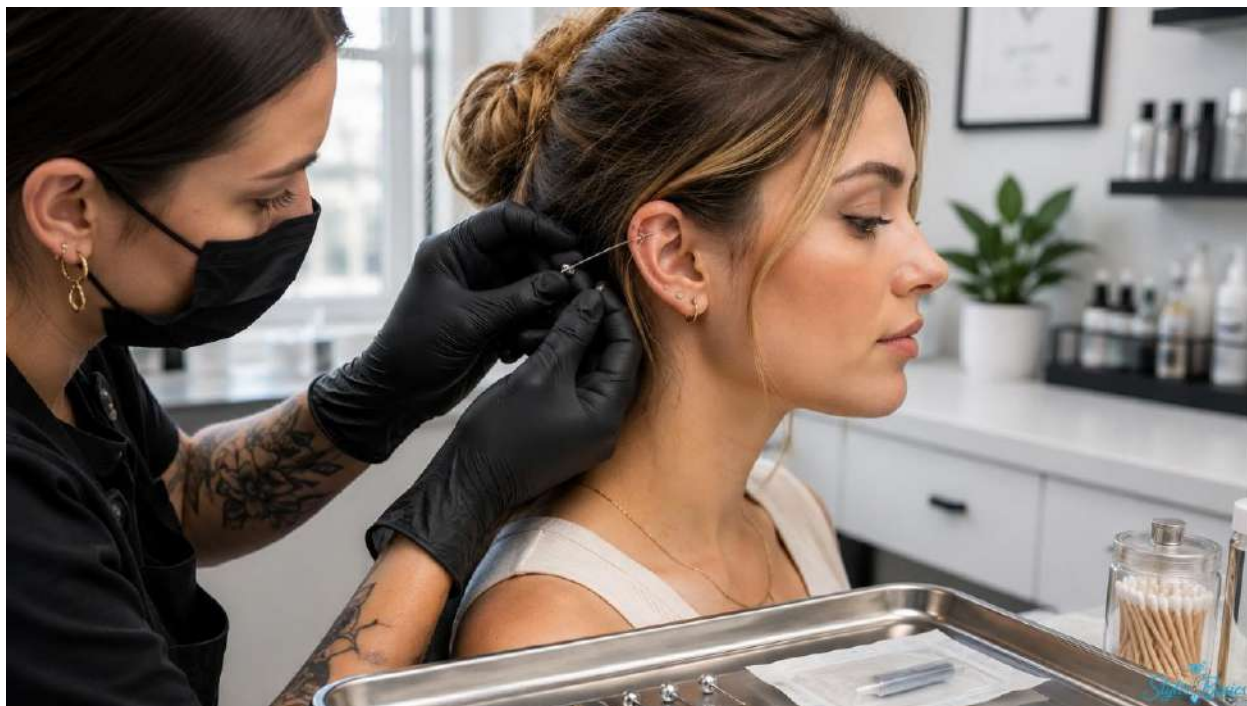


How Much Does a Helix Piercing Cost? Average Prices and What to Expect
